

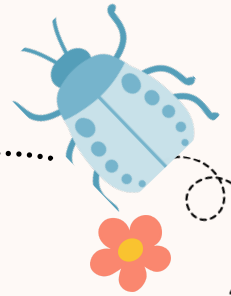

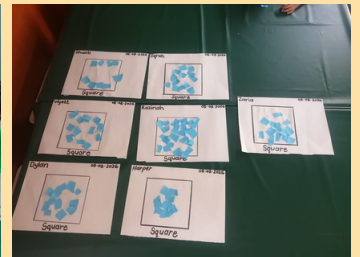
Story Time

Story time is a special part of the day where children can relax, listen and explore their imagination. It helps develop their language, vocabulary, listening skills and concentration. Children enjoy looking at pictures, turning the pages and joining in with familiar words and sounds.



Tear & Paste

Tear and paste activities are a fun way for children to develop their fine motor skills and hand - eye coordination. children enjoy tearing paper into small pieces and pasting them onto a picture or shape. This activity also encourages creativity, concentration and independence while making learning enjoyable



Puzzle Building

Puzzle building is a fun and engaging activity that helps children develop problem - solving skills, concentration and hand-eye coordination,. As children fit the pieces together, they learn to recognise shapes, colours and patterns while building confidence and patience.





Time to unwind

Our little ones have wonderfully busy days at the Baby Centre! From the moment they arrive, they are exploring, playing, moving, listening, touching, communicating and learning. Their developing senses are constantly taking in the sounds, sights, textures, movement and social interaction around them.

By home time, some children have simply had enough stimulation for one day. They may become tearful, clingy, irritable or emotional when they see Mom or Dad — and this does not necessarily mean that they have had an unhappy day. Very often, seeing their safe and familiar person is the moment when they finally feel able to “let go” after a long, busy day.

What they may need most at this time is less stimulation, not more: a quiet journey home, a familiar routine, gentle reassurance and lots of closeness. A firm, comforting cuddle or being held close can provide calming deep-pressure input and help some little bodies settle and regulate.

So, if your little one sometimes greets you with tears at the end of the day, don't be too alarmed. They may simply be telling you, in the only way they know how, “I've had a very big day. I need you now.” ❤️
